Notes

1. Congratulations on completing the Strategic Roadmap. During my hiring process and throughout the past several months, you have been clear about your desire to expand our impact and address unmet need. Through individual conversations, committee work, and full Board discussion, you helped shape a shared vision for how Champions For Learning can serve more students more effectively. Your adoption of the Strategic Roadmap and related resolution sets a clear direction for the organization and aligns leadership, staff, resources, and partners around common priorities. Well done.
2. As part of the expansion of our student programs, the creation of a CFL-designed, parallel program to Take Stock in Children (TSIC) presents an opportunity to clarify and strengthen our program branding. Our plan is as follows:
 - No change to the *Take Stock in Children* name
 - Our CFL parallel program serving students entering in grade 8 will be known as *Pathways to Success – Foundations*
 - Our existing program serving students entering in grade 10 will be rebranded from College & Career Prep to *Pathways to Success – Accelerate*
 - Collectively, we will refer to TSIC, Pathways to Success – Foundations, and Pathways to Success – Accelerate as our *College & Career Prep Programs*

Under this approach, our non-TSIC programs are unified under the Pathways to Success name. The *Foundations* designation reflects the earlier grade-8 entry point and the opportunity to build a strong base for post-secondary success over time. The *Accelerate* designation reflects the intensified pace of college and career preparation that occurs once students reach spring of grade 10.

We sought input on branding from a group of Collier County Public Schools principals, counselors, and district-level leaders; discussed options multiple times with the full CFL staff; and shared an earlier version of this plan at the November Board meeting. That discussion prompted us to move away from the previously considered Pathway Promise – Foundations and Pathway Promise – Launch naming approach.

As with most branding decisions, we recognize that unanimity among stakeholders is unlikely. After careful consideration, we are enthusiastic about this direction and believe it provides clarity and coherence as our programs expand. We anticipate using these names publicly as early as February 2.

If you have any questions, please let me know.

3. We are seeking your help recruiting volunteers across all programs, with an immediate need for mentors for 8th grade students entering *Take Stock in Children* and *Pathways to Success – Foundations* in early March. We expect to admit approximately 68 students, each requiring a mentor.

5. The Night For Champions Gala is only one month away! If you have not yet made Wyatt aware of plans to buy a table or tickets, please do so asap. 6. The Florida Department of Education recently announced 2025 high school graduation rates. As explained in the accompanying brief from Collier County Public Schools (CCPS), the district earned a "2025 graduation rate of 94.4%, outperforming that State average by 2.2 percentage points." This is the highest 4-year graduation rate in the history of Collier County. We are so fortunate to partner with such an exemplary school district – significant unmet needs exist and CCPS is doing a great job working to meet those needs. pps.7-8

Mid-Year Volunteer Survey Summary, FY2026

The mid-year volunteer survey was delivered in December of 2025 to 571 volunteers with 387 recipients opening the email for a 67% open rate. A total of 91 volunteers completed the survey, resulting in a 23.5% recipient response rate. Overall feedback reflects a positive volunteer experience, with 96.7% of respondents reporting they are highly satisfied (42.85%) or satisfied (53.85%) with their overall volunteer experience.

Survey results demonstrate reliable performance across key engagement areas. 83.5% of respondents rated their volunteer orientation and training as excellent or good, and 89% agreed or strongly agreed that Champions For Learning provides clear and timely communication. Volunteers also reported feeling valued, with 85.7% feeling highly valued or valued.

Volunteer retention and advocacy indicators were notably higher. 93.4% of respondents stated they are very likely or likely to continue volunteering with Champions For Learning. In addition, 90% reported being very likely or likely to recommend volunteering with the organization to family, friends, and colleagues.

While these results reflect respectable volunteer engagement, we are committed to continuously enhancing our processes, systems, and practices to ensure every volunteer has a positive and supported experience.

Samples of Final Thoughts and Suggestions:

I have volunteered for Champions For Learning in a variety of roles for the past 10 years. The mission of the organization is close to my heart as a retired educator. Although many of the staff members are fairly new to the organization at this point, I am pleased with the direction Champions is headed at this point in time. I think everyone is on the same page. Thank you for all that you are doing to support our volunteers.

I have enjoyed volunteering for the last several years, actually over 20 years. I think the transition in staffing has caused some communication interruptions. However, I feel that this will be resolved quickly now that the new staff is in place. I enjoy volunteering and would like to continue.

This is one of the best organizations in Florida. I very much enjoy being a volunteer and appreciate all the effort the new staff has been making to increase communication.

It has been an interesting 6 years of volunteering. Since Dr. Williams arrived, the communication and resumption of best practices from past years is much appreciated and will better prepare the Champions students.

There were three changes in personnel during my volunteer tenure. Each had a different approach and brought different energy to the volunteers assisting with the programs. More opportunities to interact with other volunteers and participate with teachers and students would improve the experience.

I am a long-time volunteer with a variety of experiences. Over the past 3 years, there has been a great deal of staff turnover. Prior to that timeframe, my experience was exceptional; however, with the turnover, the volunteer support waned. I believe that, with new leadership in place, things will stabilize and strong volunteer engagement will be restored. Volunteers are the lifeblood of Champions For Learning.

I've been a volunteer mentor with Champions for Learning for several years. CFL is excellent asset to our community, and I am proud to be a part of it. My only concern is the high turnover of staff, especially over the last 4 or 5 years. That being said, the organization seems stronger than ever.

The current changes to the administration have enhanced Champions' efficiency in educating and supporting volunteers.

I am very pleased with the new team of leaders at CFL. They are enthusiastic, committed and competent. Keep up the good work. Recognizing volunteers in many ways helps to keep them involved and also helps to recruit new volunteers.

Volunteer experience and communication have improved significantly since Nicole and Anne have been on board. Continue providing as much lead time as possible to volunteers.

There is a lot of work to be done regarding recruiting and onboarding for the program to be successful in the future, in my opinion.

The Florida Department of Education (FDOE) released high school graduation rates for the Class of 2025 on January 13, 2026. The graduation rate for the State of Florida is 92.2%. Collier County Public Schools (CCPS) proudly announces our 2025 graduation rate is 94.4%, outperforming the State average by 2.2 percentage points. Out of 67 school districts in Florida, the CCPS Class of 2025 ranks 13th for graduation rate. This marks a significant increase from the rank of 25th for the Class of 2024. This level of achievement reflects the successful efforts to provide high-quality instruction and consistent monitoring and support to meet the needs of all students.

"I am incredibly proud of the Class of 2025 for their resilience and dedication in reaching this significant milestone. Their success reflects not only their own hard work, but also the consistent guidance, expertise, and commitment of our teachers, administrators, and staff at every stage of a student's journey from elementary through high school. As we recognize this accomplishment, we remain committed to closely monitoring and supporting students who still need additional help to meet graduation requirements. Our continued focus is ensuring that every student has access to the resources, support, and opportunities necessary to graduate and move confidently toward their future goals. With CCPS achieving the highest graduation rate in the six-county Southwest Florida region, and more than 94 percent of students graduating in four years, this record-breaking success further demonstrates why our community can trust Collier County Public Schools to deliver exceptional results." ~ Dr. Leslie C. Chief Development Officer (Nancy Mireles)

- We are thrilled to have received a significant gift of \$600,000 to support our plans for program expansion.
- We have also received a verbal 3-year gift commitment of \$150,000/year for a total of \$450,000 to support program expansion.
- Eric & I are continuing to work together to connect with our largest donors and engage each of them in a way that is meaningful for them and Champions.
- All donors will be receiving either an email or mailed letter with a summary of their 2025 giving to Champions For Learning, by the end of the month.
- Through our relationship with Veritus, we have designed a plan to communicate with our mid-major level donors and start connecting through a qualification process, beginning with an introduction letter.
- On January 28th we will host a visit from Richard Perry with Giving Pathways. He will meet with the Development Committee and Staff to engage in workshops around our fundraising philosophy, creating a culture of philanthropy, marketing & communications best practices, storytelling, and creating a solid donor pipeline communications calendar.

 - Year End Giving Summary – I worked with Sydney and Mary to send out 2025 calendar year giving summaries to donors

Night for Champions Gala: February 21, 2026

- Gala invitations have been delivered, and we have seen our ticket sales begin to pick up. If there are any individuals you would like for us to mail a physical invitation to, please reach out to Wyatt.
- We currently have 240 guests confirmed, 10 Patron Tables & 7 sponsors; with room for more! If you know of an individual or company who might like to host a table or sponsor the event, please let us know and we can coordinate an introduction.

Golden Apple Celebration: April 17, 2026

- We are currently finalizing the items for the sponsorship mailing which should be mailed out the week of January 12th.
- The team is working with our designing company on Golden Apple Celebration Invitations which should be dropping in mailboxes in early March.

Digital Fundraising & Operations (Sydney Fahrenbruch)

Year End Communication: A series of emails went out throughout the end of December and beginning of January.

- 12/15: The first donor newsletter was sent to all donors from the last 3 years (717 total emails) featuring updates on our programs and current news. The goal of the newsletter is to keep donors engaged and updated on what their contributions are supporting. We had a 57% open rate and 3% click-through rate.
- 12/27: The year end giving reminders email was sent out with reminders on year end giving and tax rules, as well as information on ways to make a gift (IRA, Securities, Donor Advised Funds, etc.). This had a 36% open rate and a 1% click-through rate.
- 1/1: We sent a simple happy new year email thanking our donors for their support and looking forward to the year ahead. This had a 36% open rate and a 1% click-through-rate.
- 1/15: The 2025 Year End Giving Summary email was sent to all donors in 2025, thanking them for their contribution including their total giving amount in 2025. A mailed version of the letter will be going out to those we do not have email addresses for.

Event Related Communications

- We sent a digital Save The Date for the Golden Apple Celebration of Teachers to our email database on 12/19, accompanied by a post on our social media platforms. We also updated the website so ticket and sponsorship information is now available online.
- In conjunction with the invites dropping, we sent an email version of the Night For Champions invite on 1/9, in addition to social media posts going out on our channels. We also now have a popup on our website that brings you to the Night For Champions page.

Golden Apple Television Broadcast

- On 1/13, myself, Wyatt, Marilyn, and Nancy met with Drew at the Naples Studio to discuss next steps for the Golden Apple Celebration of Teachers Broadcast. We will be working with Drew on production in addition to Gulf Coast News and CCPS's communication team. We are still in the planning stages but we will be working closely with all parties involved as we get closer to Prize Patrol Day and the Golden Apple Celebration of Teachers event.

Student Programs:

The Student Programs team has completed 100% of semester 1 coaching sessions. Second semester coaching sessions are now being booked by students. The year ended with mentor sessions averaging 93% having 2 sessions per month. December 22nd was Day of Service at Empowerment Farms. We had 35 students attend with 3 mentors. CFL's mentor Zoom sessions started back on January 7th. On January 13th, 9-11th grade students were in a Zoom workshop we hosted with FGCU to discuss dual enrollment opportunities. The 12th graders had a workshop on "How to Write Thank Yous & Etiquette." On January 20th, all grades have a Zoom workshop on Summer Enrichment. Staff have been working hard to put together a large variety of opportunities for students to engage in the summer. This workshop will also be shared with mentors as a learning session. Tracy Jones is working with different CCPS school sites to book more FASFA completion workshops. So far, our Seniors have completed 398 college applications and acceptances are starting to roll in. Staff are working to collect that data as we see students. 70% have had their FASFA processed and gotten their results back. Our 10th grade College and Career Preparation application is now open. On January 14th, Eric, Yuliana, Tracy, and I met with a few Board members to discuss program expansion.
